Independence & Self-care Skills

Giving children a chance to practice self-care skills is a fantastic way to help them feel capable and increase their self-esteem. It helps create a great sense of autonomy, a drive to learn and grow. Below are some ideas of how we can encourage children to become more independent.

Take off their own coat and hang up on nursery peg with their bag when they come in.

Put away some of their own clothes.

Help to make their own bed.

Dress self (they may need some help, especially with buttons & zips)

Put on/ take off shoes (it's helpful to avoid laces).

Explore what weather appropriate clothing means.

Toileting - Useful Tips

- Wear easy clothing such as leggings or jog trousers rather than skinny jeans or dungarees.
- Popper vests make it very difficult for children to try the toilet, t-shirt style vests are much easier.
- Pull ups mean that children can try the toilet when they show any interest.
- Please talk to your child's keyworker about toilet training so that we can work together.
